1. ENVIRONMENT STATISTICS

This section presents data on the geographical location of the EAC Partner States, total agricultural land, total cultivated land, land under plantation as well as land under other vegetation cover. The EAC region is located between 5°30"N, 12°S, 28°45"E and 41° 50" E, and comprises of Burundi, Tanzania, Uganda, Kenya, and Rwanda as indicated in Table 1.1a.

The region has a total surface area of 1,817.7 thousand square kilometres. Tanzania accounts for slightly over half (51.7%) of the surface area while Burundi and Rwanda account for equal shares of the surface area at 1.5 per cent each. Kenya and Uganda account for 32.1 and 13.3 per cent, respectively. The region has a total land surface area of 1,716.7 thousand square kilometres as shown in Table 1.1b.

Table 1.1c shows the total agricultural land use for the period 2001-2014. The EAC total agricultural land was estimated at 108,443 thousand hectares. Proportionately, the Republic of Kenya accounts for 52 percent of the total agricultural land use followed by Tanzania at 44 per cent while Rwanda and Burundi, accounts for 2, and 1 per cent, respectively. Uganda, their status is not stated.

Table 1.1d presents data on forest and tree resources from 2001 to 2014. The EAC has a total forest plantation cover of 8.5 thousand square kilometres. The Republic of Rwanda has the highest area under plantation forest cover at 4.0 thousand square kilometres, an indication that the country is doing better than the other Partner States in regard to attaining the minimum 10 percent forest cover.

2. SOCIAL STATISTICS

This section presents statistics on demography, health, education and culture.

2.1 Demography

The information in this section is mainly obtained from population censuses and Demographic and Health Surveys (DHS). Mid-year population figures are based on population census as well as projections derived using annual population growth rates, fertility rates, mortality rates and migration. The mid-year population projection in the EAC region was estimated at 145.5 million persons in 2014 compared to an estimated 141.8 million persons in 2013, representing a 2.6 percent growth rate. The region's population density grew modestly from 83.6 in 2013 to 84.7 in 2014 as a consequence of the growth in population. Life expectancy in EAC Partners States in 2014 ranged between 50 and 65 years with Rwanda having the highest life expectancy at 65 years while Uganda has the lowest at 50 years.

2.2 Education

The section outlines indicators on net and gross enrolment rates at primary and secondary level, completion rates, transition rates, literacy rates as well as quality enhancement indicators such as pupil/student-teacher ratio and pupil/student-classroom ratio.

Table 2.2b reveals an improvement for Burundi, Kenya and Rwanda where they counted a decline in gross primary enrolment rates, and a slight increase in net primary enrolment in 2014 compared to 2013.

Whereas in Table 2.2c, on gross secondary enrolment rate, shows that Rwanda improved from 41.5 to 40.7 percentage points while on net secondary enrolment decreased. In the same table, Burundi and Kenya endure noticeable increases on both gross and net secondary enrolment in 2013 to 2014.

According to the available data, the primary completion rate for Burundi and Kenya slightly increased from 68 to 71 percent and 78 to 79 percent respectively; on the other side Rwanda showed a decrease of 69 to 62 percent.

2.3 Health

Health facilities in the EAC region are grouped according to the services offered. Table 2.3a shows that the region's referral hospitals remained at 20 for three consecutive years.

Table 2.3c shows that, DPT3 immunisation coverage in Tanzania and Uganda increased to 88 percent and 83 percent respectively in 2014. The rate for Kenya and Burundi stagnated to 76 percent and 99 percent in 2014.

In 2014, Kenya presented a merger increase (40 percentage point increase) of deliveries assisted by trained health workers, from 44 percent in 2013 to 62 percent in 2014. On the other hand Uganda indicates an increase of 13 percentage point from 39 percent in 2013 to 44 percent in 2014.

2.5 Labour

2.6 Culture

This sub-section presents indicators on culture in the EAC Partner States. The framework for cultural statistics is intended to capture activities and describes the major components of the cultural sector in EAC Partner States. The cultural venues identified in the framework include the following venues and activities: art gallery; museum; animal/marine park; botanical garden; library; popular music concert; classical music concert; theatre; dance; opera or musical theatre; and other

performing arts. However, the statistics on these activities have remained scanty. As shown in Table 2.6a, the total number of museums in the region has remained 19 since 2011.

3. MACRO ECONOMIC STATISTICS

This section presents statistics on National accounts, Prices, Public Finance, Balance of Payments, Tourism, Money & Banking, Transport, Postal services, Communication, and Investment profiles. For comparison purposes, all indicators except otherwise stated, have been converted to US Dollars using the average annual exchange rates and end period exchange rates of the EAC Partner States for flow and stock data, respectively.

3.1 National Accounts

This sub-section presents indicators on Gross Domestic Product (GDP). The compilation of national accounts statistics in all EAC Partner States is based on the System of National Accounts 1993 (SNA93) framework.

The Partner States have been harmonising their National Account Statistics (NAS) compilation practices, with the overall objective of producing NAS aggregates that are broadly directly comparable - in terms of same coverage, compilation methods, and base periods, among other attributes – at the national level. This is expected to facilitate direct aggregation of national NAS to estimate Gross Domestic Product (GDP) for the East African Community (EAC). The specific objective of the harmonisation programme is to produce comparable NAS estimates at:

- i) Current prices (nominal) which are needed to calculate various performance ratios (e.g., tax revenue to GDP, Government debt to GDP) for the EAC macroeconomic convergence criteria.
- ii) Constant prices (real) which are needed to assess economic growth for EAC and the relative performance of the Partner States.

In this edition of the EAC facts and Figures, the NAS aggregates presented are Gross Domestic Product (GDP) for the EAC. The aggregates are derived from national NAS which were re-referenced to a common base year (2009). This is a short-term approach to facilitate aggregation pending the adoption of a common base period of 2015 by the end of 2017. The re-referenced national NAS tables have been annexed for ease of reference.

3.2 Prices

This sub-section presents indicators on price indices, interest and exchange rates.

3.2.1 Consumer price index

The weights used for the computation of consumer price indices were derived from the household budget expenditure surveys, conducted by respective EAC Partner States in varied time periods. The base period for Kenya is 2009 Rwanda is 2014 and Tanzania is 2010, while for Burundi is 2013 and Uganda is 2005/06. In 2014, Kenya recorded the highest annual headline inflation of 6.9 percent, among the EAC Partner States, while Rwanda registered the lowest annual headline inflation of 1.8 percent.

3.2.2 Interest rates

Treasury bills offered in EAC Partner States have maturities of 91 days, 182 days and 364 days. The 91days treasury bills interest rate were highest in Tanzania with an average of 13.8 percent followed by Uganda at 10.6 percent, Kenya at 8.6 percent, Burundi at 4.4 percent, and Rwanda at 4.1 percent. The interest rate spread (short-term lending rate minus deposit rate) was highest in Uganda at 10.2 percent and lowest in Tanzania at 5.7 percent. However the lending and deposit rate was highest in Uganda at 20.7 percent and 10.5 percent respectively. Details of interest rates are highlighted in Tables 3.2e to 3.2f.

3.2.3 Nominal exchange rates

Table 3.2h presents end of period and average annual exchange rates (1 United States Dollar to the price of the local currency). The end of period exchange rates for all the currencies depreciated against the US\$ in 2014. Uganda, Tanzania and Kenya recorded the highest depreciation on an average basis of 9.7, 9.2 and 5.0 percent respectively. On the other hand Burundi currency recorded

the lowest depreciation of 0.7 percent and Rwanda currency depreciated by 3.6 percent. The annual average exchange rate for Tanzania, Kenya, Rwanda and Uganda depreciated by 3.5 percent, 2.3 percent, 2.2 percent, and 0.5 percent respectively, while Burundi currency appreciated by 0.5 percent.

Compared to 2013 aggregated broad money supply in the EAC region grew by 9.2 percent in 2014, with Rwanda recording the highest growth rate (14.3 percent) and Uganda recording the lowest (5.0 percent).

On the counterparts' side, net foreign assets grew by 0.4 percent and Kenya recorded the highest increase in net foreign assets (18.0 percent) while other countries recorded a decline with Burundi recording the highest decline (21.7 percent). On the other hand aggregated net domestic assets increase by 13.5 percent with Rwanda recording the highest increase in net domestic assets (76.7 percent) and Kenya recording the lowest increase (9.6 percent).

Aggregated credit to the private sector grew by 26.7 percent and Kenya recorded the highest growth of 39.7 percent, while Uganda recorded the lowest with 4.0 percent. Aggregated net credit to government increased by 21.7 percent, and Uganda recorded the highest increase (317.4 percent) while Kenya recorded the lowest increase of 2.2 percent.

During the year 2014, the banking system remained well capitalized with the average Capital adequacy ranging from 17.8 percent (Tanzania) to 24.2 percent (Rwanda). In 2013, this ratio was between 17.9 and 23.2 percent for Tanzania and Kenya respectively.

However, there was a slight improvement in asset quality (nonperforming loans to total gross loans) in the region, except for Burundi and Kenya which deteriorated by 0.5 and 0.4 percent respectively between 2013 and 2014. During the same period, the profitability ratios (Return on asset and return on equity) slightly improved in all Partner States except for Kenya. Nevertheless, Kenya recorded the highest return on assets and equity in the region.

3.4 Public Finance

Public finance indicators reported in this publication relate to Government revenues, expenditures, overall balances (cash basis) and their financing, as well as fiscal ratios. Government Finance Statistics (GFS) are reported on fiscal year basis (July-June) for Kenya, Uganda, Tanzania and Rwanda, while Burundi reports on a calendar year basis.

3.5 Trade and Balance of Payments

The Balance of Payments (BOP) sub-section presents data on current account balance, capital and financial account and the overall balance. Tanzania and Rwanda compile their statistics according to the IMF manual 5 (BPM5) while Kenya, Burundi and Uganda have upgraded to IMF manual 6 (BPM6). In 2014, Kenya and Uganda recorded surpluses on their overall balance, amounting to US\$ 1,434.4 million and US\$ 212.2 million respectively, while the other countries recorded a deficit in their overall balance.

In 2014, the total exports from the intra EAC trade amounted to US\$ 2,996.5 million while the total imports amounted to US\$ 2,472.1 million, thus giving an intra trade surplus of US\$ 524.3 million. Kenya and Uganda recorded a surplus balance with Tanzania, Burundi and Rwanda recording a deficit

3.7 Transport

This sub-section presents transport statistics, with a focus on access to road, air, rail, inland water ways and maritime transport in EAC Partner States.

There has been an increase in the number of international passengers in Kenya (10.8 percent) and Tanzania (6.2 percent) while Burundi and Uganda reported a decline of 6.6 and 0.9 percent respectively.

On road Transport, Uganda reported a slight increase on the number of accidents (1.7 percent) from 2013 to 2014, while Kenya and Tanzania reported a decline in accidents by 8.6 percent and 39.8 percent respectively.

3.8 Communication Services

The access and use of Information and Communication Technology (ICT) is essential for the development of the EAC region, both from an economic and social viewpoint. ICT is growing at a fast rate in region but the reported statistical indicators to measure this development are not adequate. The main ICT indicators currently available on a regular basis are related to fixed telephones, mobile subscriptions, and the number of radio and TV stations. With the exception of public payphones which have somewhat stagnated, all other available indicators point to sustained growth in the sector across the EAC region.

4. PRODUCTION STATISTICS

The section presents indicators on agriculture and livestock production, energy, mineral exploration, manufacturing and industrial production, and construction & quarrying.

4.1 Agricultural and Livestock Production

This section presents statistics on land area and production volumes for selected crops livestock, fish catch and retail prices for selected food items.

4.1.1 Crop Production

Land area under tea increased by less than 5 percent in 2014 for all Partner States except Rwanda where it increased by 11.4 percent. Similarly, Land area under coffee remained relatively stable for all Partner States except for Rwanda where it increased from 52,000 hectares in 2013 to 55,000 hectares in 2014.

All Partner States recorded significant declines in coffee production in 2014 except Kenya which report an increase of 24.4 percent. In contrast, production of tea rose in all Partner States except for Tanzania which stagnated at about 34,000 tonnes.

4.1.2 Agro-Products Retail Prices

Generally, the average retail market prices for maize flour, rice and beans declined while that of beef increased by 3.0 percent in 2014. Notably, the average price of maize flour for all Partner States dropped from US\$ 0.76 in 2013 to US\$ 0.63 in 2014 as indicated in Table 4.1C.

4.1.3 Livestock and Fisheries

The stock of cattle in Uganda and Burundi increased by 6.7 and 4.6 percent, respectively, in 2014. Similarly, the stock of poultry in Uganda and Burundi increased by 3.0 percent and 14.9 percent, respectively, in 2014. On the other hand, the stock of sheep and goats for Uganda and Burundi declined in 2014 as indicated in Table 4.1e.

The volume of fish landed increased by 10.2 and 2.7 percent in Kenya and Uganda, respectively, in 2014.

4.2 Energy

This sub section presents statistics on energy production, use and prices.

4.2.1 Energy Production

Table 4.2a shows the installed energy production capacity by type. The installed capacity for hydro electricity decreased in Tanzania while it remained relatively stable in Uganda and Burundi in 2014. However, the installed hydro capacity increased by 3.9 percent in 2014. Installed capacity for thermal energy in Uganda rose by percent in 2014 after declining significantly from 170 MW in

2011 to 100 MW in 2013. Installed capacity for geothermal energy in Kenya has been increasing steadily over the last seven years to stand at 348 MW in 2014 from 128 MW in 2008.

Generation of hydro electricity in Tanzania increased significantly from 1,717 GWH in 2013 to 2,591 GWH in 2014. Contrastingly, hydro electricity generation in Kenya declined by 19.5 percent in 2014. Generation of geothermal electricity increased by 63.8 percent in Kenya as a result of the increased installed capacity.

4.2.2 Energy Exports and Imports

Details of energy exports and imports are presented in Table 4.2c. Electricity exports from Uganda increased by 59.4 percent in 2014 while that of Kenya and Tanzania declined by 29.5 and 2.3 percent, respectively. However, electricity imports to Uganda declined by 28.7 percent in 2014 while electricity imports to Kenya more than tripled to 158,400 MW in 2014.

The value of exports of petroleum products in Kenya increased substantially from US\$ 138 million in 2013 to US\$ 538 million in 2014 while that of Uganda increased from US\$ 132 million in 2013 to US\$ 145 million in 2014. The value of imports of petroleum products increased for Burundi, Uganda and Kenya with Burundi recording the highest growth of 18.0 percent in 2014. The value of imports of petroleum products for Tanzania declined by 15.1 percent in 2014.

4.2.3 Energy Use and Prices

Data on electricity tariffs by type of customer are presented in Table 4.2e. There were slight changes in tariffs mainly as a result of changes in the respective US dollar exchange rates. Electricity tariffs for domestic customers remained higher than those of other categories of customers in all Partner States except Rwanda where the industrial customer tariffs were highest.

The percentage share of electricity valued added to GDP remained at 0.8 percent for Tanzania but declined to 0.8 and 1.0 percent in Uganda and Kenya, respectively in 2014.

4.5 Construction and Quarrying

Table 4.5a below indicates increase in cement consumption from 9.9 million tonnes in 2013 to 11.8 million tonnes in 2014. Volume of cement consumption increased notably by 19.7, 17.4 and 21.8 percent in Tanzania, Uganda and Kenya, respectively in 2014. This was as a result of increased production mainly from Tanzania and Kenya by 19.2 and 16.3 percent, respectively, in 2014.
